

As our fiscal year ends on June 30th, this signifies an important time to meet our financial goals so we can continue training and discipling PAACS residents. Please pray as we push forward for God to abundantly supply all our needs. As the fiscal year closes, we will begin preparing for our annual audit and the development of the PAACS 2022-2023 Annual Report. The Annual Report will showcase the impact of PAACS on the lives of residents, graduates, and those they have served this past year, which was made possible by the support of our generous donors and partners.

Lastly, we are already well under way in preparing the new Daily Prayer Guide. While it will be a few months before it's published, we look forward to sharing it with you and standing united in prayer for PAACS and its mission.

LOMA LINDA UNIVERSITY SITE VISITS


Dr. Mark Reeves, PAACS Board of Directors Loma Linda University (LLU) Representative and longtime friend of PAACS, with Dr. Andrei Radulescu, Pediatric Surgeon at LLU, were accompanied by PAACS Executive Vice President Dr. Keir Thelander while making accreditation visits to the PAACS programs at Harpur Memorial Hospital in Menouf, Egypt, and Malamulo Adventist Hospital (MAH) in Makwasa, Malawi.

After some minor travel inconveniences, they celebrated with Dr. Amgad Nashat in his graduation ceremony at Harpur. On Wednesday, the site visit took place. The development of the facility with an additional three-story building provides a wonderful outpatient surgical clinic, in addition to a state-of-the-art CT scanner and casualty department. The training and discipleship program equally demonstrates growth, now with three general surgical faculty and one plastic surgeon. Dr. Paul Lim and Dr. Shady Fayik took a program with a solid foundation (thanks to the leadership of Dr. Dave Thompson and, most recently, Dr. Sherif Hanna) and have propelled it forward educationally.

Travel continued with an overnight flight to Addis on the way to Blantyre. On arrival, meetings were held at Mercy James Pediatric Hospital where PAACS graduate Dr. Alliance Niyukuri will complete pediatric surgery training in December 2023. Meetings with Dr. Eric Borgstein and the Queen's Hospital Oncology Director went well before embarking on the one hour drive to Malamulo Adventist Hospital.

MAH's PAACS training and discipleship program's progress continues. Under the leadership of Dr. Moses Kasumba, PAACS Mbingo Baptist Hospital graduate, the program has advanced to become an excellent learning environment. Though the hospital's financial struggles resulted in much staff discord and challenges with supplies, case volumes increased during Covid and remain at these levels providing numerous teaching opportunities.

Finally, the team traveled to Nkhoma Mission Hospital to visit this 1.5-year-old program implemented at an over 100-year-old hospital. Stability has grown over this time in large part due to the efforts of Program Director Dr. Jens Vaylann and the surgical team that God has assembled: Dr. Yamikani Limbe, Dr. Wanda Lam, Dr. Beth Stuebing, and Dr. Bernhard Widmann. With strong support from hospital administration, the impact of this PAACS program in raising the level of care is undeniable. The trip was an immense success. PAACS is thankful for these collaborations and the work by the hospital administration, PAACS program directors, and faculty that has clearly catalyzed the growth of the institutions while training and discipling excellent surgeons and disciple-makers. We look forward to the first graduates from Nkhoma in December 2027 while anticipating continued growth and effectiveness of Harpur and Malamulo. Praise the Lord for the work He is doing.



MBINGO BAPTIST HOSPITAL: FIVE YEARS LATER

When I visited Mbingo Baptist Hospital in 2018, the residents had just returned from being evacuated due to the civil unrest. Subsequently, many of the residents relocated to other programs around the continent and the surgeons remaining there faced a daunting task. In March/April of this year—five years later—I was able to visit Mbingo again and bring my endocrine surgery fellow with me to participate in the head & neck fellowship program there. Our PAACS fellow Dr. Penngnan Keofon Nchifor has become a skillful head and neck surgeon through her time there and is a pleasure to work with. Although the civil unrest is still present, there is generally a consensus that things are better than they were. A nearly full contingent of residents has filled the ranks at Mbingo and whereas I was the lone short termer last time, this time there were several expatriate short and longer termers sharing their skills and talents.


We were able to do surgery for about 15 patients including several impressive thyroid goiters, two mandibulectomies, resection of a carotid body tumor, a parotidectomy, a suppurative thyroiditis penetrating through the chest wall, and several facial fracture repairs. It was great to see the surgical team work well together and to see my fellow from New York work together with the PAACS fellow from Cameroon, Dr. Nchifor. I was humbled in that a couple of complications occurred during surgery and I was somewhat embarrassed. I realized that I need to redouble my carefulness in a somewhat unfamiliar environment and that I always have to trust God for the patient outcomes as I am a fallible human surgeon.

I think the highlight of the trip was some very meaningful conversations with some of the surgeons and residents there. Being married to a Nigerian doctor myself, I have some familiarity with the struggles of weighing a sacrificial calling against the expectations of the extended family in the African context, and our reasonable responsibility to our family's needs. Encouragement went both ways as we dove into these issues and others.

Please continue to pray for lasting peace and justice for the region, as well as excellence, compassion, perseverance, and a deep love for Jesus in the trainees and surgeons (myself included).



REFLECTIONS ON THE PAACS DAILY PRAYER GUIDE AND A RECOMMENDATION

In a former PAACS Bulletin entry ([Nov 2021](#)), I mentioned, “Get in the habit of having good habits.” In that regard, I recommend you incorporate the PAACS Daily Prayer Guide into your devotions. I prioritize and seek to read and reflect on each day’s entry. This exercise helps me learn the faces, families, concerns of our trainees, faculty, many alumni, and administration and even see the faces and names of our board members.

We are thus reminded each day to pray generally and specifically for the many individuals that comprise our PAACS family. Many prayer requests fall into categories such as concerns for one’s family, especially the education of children, peace, success on PAACS or COSECSA exams, faculty number, a resurgence in volunteer faculty, financial issues, etc. Plus, the several introductory pages give us encouragement from Susan Koshy and Ed Scarce with specific prayers for PAACS on Day 1.

Some comments taken from the 2022-2023 PAACS Daily Prayer Guide follow.

- To “find rest in the business of life.”
- Prayers for security, countries afflicted by insecurities, protection.
- Jobs for spouses. A future spouse.
- Opportunities for further training in various specialties.
- Peace in and for Niger, Cameroon, Burundi, Ethiopia, the DRC, and no doubt, other countries.
- Patient care. That God would provide more workers.
- Wisdom in bringing up kids as they grow older.
- Medical problems in parents, spouses, children and no doubt in some trainees and faculty.
- Guidance on future service.
- Both praise for the number and unity among faculty and the need for more faculty.
- Requests for new PAACS programs where current graduates now serve.
- God’s provision, protection, and good health.

In my daily prayer time, I utilize the acronym ACTS: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication, placing my requests last. I also use various prayers and hymns directed to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. For the Holy Spirit, one such chorus is “Spirit of the Living God,” the text by Daniel Iverson who noted Acts 11:15.


