Dr. Noel Ndayisenge's Story – PAACS Resident


“ Because of what we did for him in our hospital, he said he was ready to give his life to Christ.”

An 18-year-old boy was the assistant driver of a truck on its way from Benin to Niger. The truck got a flat tire close to our hospital. As the young man was under it trying to change the tire, another truck came and hit his truck from behind. A tire of his truck ran over his leg, crushing it. I was on call that day at the hospital. The young man arrived, screaming in pain, shouting and calling for help. I received him and called the team to assist me. His soft tissue and skin were crushed, but fortunately, he had no fractured bones. We washed his wounds thoroughly, which is our routine. The Lord helped us to save his leg.

THE YOUNG MAN WAS NOT A BELIEVER. I took my time to build a relationship, hoping to share the Gospel of Christ with him. He had no family nearby to bring him food. My fellow residents and I decided to help him with food supplies as support for his treatment. He received the message of the Gospel with great joy and allowed me to pray with him. In time, he opened himself up to me. He told me that he was really touched by the way he was received and treated with compassion, without paying money beforehand! He was amazed by the love he saw in us. He was angry with his boss, who never came to visit him, but rather just came to see his truck. He stated that he has never seen such love in other people.

HE MENTIONED HIS MOTHER IS A CHRISTIAN. She tried to bring him to Christ in vain, but because of what we did for him in our hospital, he said he was ready to give his life to Christ. I continued to encourage him, helped by a team of evangelists that work together with us. We discharged him home after a skin graft was successfully applied on his wounds. I haven't seen him since, but hopefully

he is now indwelt by the love of Jesus, and he is His follower. I hope to meet him in heaven!
