SURGICAL TRAINING

It has been estimated that only 6% of the world's surgical procedures occur in the poorest countries, yet these countries are home to over 33% of the world's population. To meet the expected demand in Africa, an additional 42 million procedures would be needed EVERY YEAR!

In many regions of Africa over 99% of the population does not have access to safe, timely, and affordable surgical, anesthesia, and obstetric care. Comparing access across the globe, a stark difference is seen.

PAACS is striving to improve access to quality surgical, anesthesia, and obstetric care in areas where it is needed most. By training and discipling African Christian surgeons and related specialists who are willing to go into the under-resourced areas, more people will find access to better care while hearing the gospel.



SPIRITUAL DISCIPLESHIP

A unique factor of PAACS training programs is the fusion of surgical training with spiritual discipleship. Faculty and residents live life together, working, studying, worshiping, praying, eating, crying, laughing, everything for their five years in training. It resembles the model that Christ had with His disciples.

At PAACS, residents are given every opportunity to deepen their faith, grow in their spiritual commitment, and mature as disciples of Christ. This way they are confident in sharing their own faith with others and praying for their patients, families, and communities.

PAACS uses a 5-year spiritual curriculum designed to accompany each of the five years of training. Through weekly Bible studies they grow as followers of Jesus. As part of our strategic plan, facilitator's guides are nearly complete to help with execution of the spiritual curriculum. We also strive for all programs to hold a yearly spiritual retreat. We are thankful that every PAACS program participated in a retreat this past fiscal year. Growth as a believer is never over, and we strive to find ways for everyone to deepen their relationship with Christ and make disciples within their area of influence.



STEPPING AWAY: Rural Church Planting

In a bold move, Dr. Abenezer lyassu (second-year orthopaedic surgery resident at Soddo/CURE) felt a strong calling to take a one-year break from his training and venture into rural church planting with a remote southern Ethiopian tribe. The young and disunited congregation was in desperate need of guidance and spiritual nourishment. Dr. lyassu could not ignore the pressing need that tugged at his heart. Recognizing that God had placed this mission on his path, he made the courageous decision to step away from his residency, despite initial reluctance from his family and the temporary interruption it caused in his training.

Reflecting on the transformative year, Dr. Iyassu shared, "During this journey, I learned a profound lesson: It is always best to obey God and His calling. When we step out in obedience, He has already prepared a path for our feet. God orchestrated the formation of the church, raised up evangelists, and provided the necessary resources. He sustained me with unwavering encouragement throughout." Drawing inspiration from the biblical account of Abram, who left the comfort of familiar surroundings to embark on a divine journey to a new home, Dr. Iyassu acknowledges the fears and uncertainties that come with such obedience. However, he firmly believes that the alternative, settling for less than what God has in store, is never as fulfilling or rewarding.

SPIRITUAL RETREATS: New Roots and New Growth

The newest PAACS program at Togo's Hospital of Hope made a faithful choice to launch their program in January, beginning with a spiritual retreat. Program Director, Dr. Bryce Nattier recognized the vital role of a solid biblical foundation in PAACS training. Faculty and residents gathered to deepen their faith, begin forming strong bonds, and foster a shared sense of purpose together. This inaugural retreat isn't just a promising start; it signifies the program's dedication to cultivating both surgical proficiency and spiritual resilience among residents and faculty, setting the stage for an inspiring journey ahead.

As with every faithful journey, where there is growth, there is change. Across the continent in Ethiopia, a combined retreat was held for the Soddo and CURE-Addis programs. It had been long desired to create an event where PAACS residents and alumni could have an opportunity for encouragement and spiritual refreshment together. In total, this year there were around 50 attendees, including five PAACS graduates!

RESIDENTS

At the heart of our mission lie the dedicated PAACS residents and fellows who have a profound calling to treat the sick and suffering of Africa with compassion. Their commitment to surgical excellence and spiritual growth creates remarkable surgeons and related specialists who will reach some of the most under-served communities.

Through the guidance of board-certified surgeons, trainees are receiving quality training and strong mentorship. The process involves direct supervision of hands-on training, ensuring that skills are cultivated with precision. Pre- and post-operative care form integral components of their education, nurturing well-rounded caregivers who understand the importance of holistic healing. Their journey isn't confined to operating rooms; it extends to clinical and academic studies. Rigorous yearly exams and testing confirm their proficiency. Engaging in research, they contribute to the ever-evolving landscape of medical knowledge.

This year, the larger PAACS community came together at two pivotal conferences that foster the growth of our trainees. In October, the first ever Senior Resident Conference was held for fourth and fifth-year residents. With 29 residents in attendance, it celebrated the nearing completion of their training and preparation for a new chapter in their surgical career. Each day of this conference began with worship and the Word—an intentional reminder of our reliance on God. In February, the Basic Science Conference prepared firstvear PAACS residents with a foundation for their future surgical and missionary endeavors. This year, 42 trainees, 39 faculty, 22 guest educators, and six administrative staff were in attendance. Due to the amazing growth of PAACS programs, this conference will now be held annually. These educational initiatives are focused on the development of attendees, enhancing patient care, and presenting how to be disciples of Christ while sharing the gospel with those most in need.

WORKGROUP CREATED

In 2022, we saw the first women's retreat organized by the women of AIC Kijabe Hospital in Kenya. The attendees recognized how similar their journeys were and the challenges they have experienced. Inspired by the Kenyan women's retreat, the women of Mbingo Baptist Hospital in Cameroon organized their own event in April 2023.

As a way to comprehensively address the needs of women in PAACS, the Women in Surgery Workgroup was formed and a PAACS-wide survey was undertaken. 


DAILY PRAYER GUIDE

The PAACS Alumni Newsletter is published twice per year. It includes moving stories submitted by PAACS graduates who are working on the frontlines across the continent.







EXPANSION

Capitalizing on PAACS' experience in surgical education and discipleship, develop new surgical training programs in underserved areas of Africa where there is a great need for a surgical workforce.

ACCREDITATION

PAACS programs are accredited through Loma Linda University (LLU) and all sub-Saharan programs are accredited by the College of Surgeons of East, Central, and Southern Africa (COSECSA). The West African College of Surgeons (WACS) provides some training oversight for certain training sites in West Africa. In addition, CANECSA (College of Anesthesiologists of East, Central, and Southern Africa) and ECSACOG (East, Central, and Southern Africa College of Obstetrician/Gynecologists) provide accreditation for the Anesthesia and Ob/Gyn programs.

SITE VISITS Completed

The last 'every five-year cycle' of PAACS site visits took place in 2016. After a Covid delay over the last few years, LLU, as an accrediting body for PAACS training sites, was able to restart these accreditation site visits from October 30 - November 6, 2022. An LLU team under the leadership of Dr. Mark Reeves, with Dr. Martin Rosenthal and Dr. Jana Davis, evaluated Arusha Lutheran Medical (Tanzania), Soddo Christian Hospital (Ethiopia), and CURE-Addis (Ethiopia). In May 2023, Dr. Reeves and Dr. Andrei Radulescu continued site visits including Harpur Memorial Hospital (Egypt), Adventist Hospital (Malawi), and Nkhoma Mission Hospital (Malawi).

These visits were successful, receiving overall positive initial reports about all sites. During the accreditation visit at Harpur, the team had the honor of celebrating the graduation of its newest surgeon, Dr. Amgad Nashat. This personal and heartfelt moment went beyond a task list, illustrating the genuine relationships PAACS fosters with its partners. Such interactions emphasize the human aspect of PAACS' mission and strengthen its collaborative approach to training in Africa. The next round of visits is currently scheduled for December 2023-January 2024, covering three sites in Kenya.

PAACS-BACKED TEAM WINS GLOBAL SURGICAL TRAINING Challenge

In 2020, the Global Surgical Training Challenge called upon teams to develop innovative solutions for teaching surgical skills in areas with limited resources. The goal was to create modules allowing clinicians to learn independently regardless of their location. A total of 44 teams representing 42 countries applied for the challenge. We are thrilled to announce that the ALL-SAFE team co-led by Dr. Grace Kim (PAACS Chair of General Surgery Council and member of the Board of Directors) and Dr. David Jeffcoach (Former PAACS Assistant Program Director, Soddo Christian Hospital) WON the Global Surgical Training Challenge Grand Prize in 2023!

Ectopic pregnancy stands as the leading cause of maternal death, and a significant contributor to infertility in women. In sub-Saharan Africa, women have an increased risk of ectopic pregnancy, yet they have little or no access to minimally invasive, laparoscopic interventions. ALL-SAFE initially focused on developing laparoscopic treatment for ectopic pregnancy in sub-Saharan Africa and later expanded to include appendectomy. As with many hospitals in the region, they found that donated equipment lay unused in operating rooms due to a shortage of adequately trained surgeons.

Over the past two years, the ALL-SAFE Team has grown to approximately 30 members across five countries. Together, they have collaborated to create training modules aimed at teaching laparoscopic surgical skills. Their unique approach sought to provide surgical education without relying on costly high-tech simulators.

ALL-SAFE plans to use the \$700,000 Grand Prize to extend its reach to other countries and medical specialties, fueled by the growing demand for their modules. Their plan includes forming partnerships with universities, hospitals, and medical centers to make these transformative training resources accessible to medical professionals worldwide.
